This form must be fully completed and presented at the Municipal Office, 546 Niagara Street, Wyoming, Ontario at least 24 hours before the start of the controlled burn.

This is to allow the office staff ample time to notify Central Control Call Centre, MOE and the applicable “Chief Fire Official” who may want to inspect the site for approval.

OPEN AIR BURNING

PURPOSE: Open Air Burning notification to the **Camlachie/Wyoming/Forest Fire Department & Dispatch**

Ontario Fire Code DIV.B. 2.6.3.4, DIV.A. 1.3.1.1. DIV.A. 1.5.1

- Farm Premises Only

SCOPE: Applies to agriculture and farming areas when open burning occurs on farm property. **Only valid for the date and time specified on page 2 of Schedule "A"**

PROCEDURE: **PROPERTY OWNER** contacts the Local Municipal Office for information and must complete the "Open Air Burning" Form #505 (Page 2).

PLYMPTON-WYOMING Municipal Office will notify the Chief Fire Official

CHIEF FIRE OFFICIAL may contact the property owner and if permission is granted for the controlled burning, the following shall take place:

RESPONSIBILITY: **The property owner/supervisor is responsible for:**

1. 911 addressing is to be used to locate the burn site - neighbours **shall** be notified of burning and the Chief Fire Official.
2. Materials to be burned:
 - building material or brush to be knocked down and burned shall be done in the smallest area possible as provided by the Chief Fire Official.
 - **DO NOT BURN** during fog and rain (smoke cannot disperse properly), or when wind speeds are high or wind directions change frequently (fires may spread rapidly).
 - to prevent air pollution problems **BURN ONLY DRY MATERIALS.**
 - **DO NOT BURN** petroleum products, tires, plastics, painted lumber, asphalt shingles or anything else that will cause excessive smoke or fumes
3. Keep the fire at least 15 meters from any buildings, vegetation, combustibles, overhead wires or underground hazards such as pipe lines and oil wells.
4. Equipment and resources **must** be available at the burning site to extinguish the fire, in the event that the fire gets out of control or is causing an adverse effect.
5. At the controlled burn site there **must** be constant competent supervision. If the open burn is to become out of control, it is the responsibility of the property owner/supervisor in charge to call 911 and notify them the open burn is out of control.
6. The property owner **shall** notify the Fire Department Official that the open burn is complete and the fire is out.

IF THE ABOVE ARE NOT FOLLOWED AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT IS CALLED OUT TO THE BURN SITE, THERE WILL BE A FEE ISSUED TO THE PROPERTY OWNER (\$350.00 per truck per hour or part hour).
